































#### ORIGIN OF THE FESTIVAL

- In the context of the 2020 confinement, the association "Films for Children" creates an online festival to allow children to stay in touch with teachers but also to get in touch with other children and discover cultural diversities around universal values and messages like humanism, ecology and poetry.
- 287,776 children in 2020 and 326,165 children in 2021 participated. Total participation 2021: 340,418 participants: 10,161 teachers, 4,092 parents and 326,165 children (303,190 at school and 22,975 at home) from 115 countries participated in Takorama 2021. France represents 77% of the worldwide participation.

#### **OBJECTIVE OF THE FESTIVAL**

- To provide children around the world with free access to auteur animated shorts in an educational context.
- The short films are accompanied by activities to allow educational extensions. The underlying objective of the festival is also to affirm the educational dimension of cinema by positioning it alongside literature and painting as a resource that can accompany and support all types of teaching. (visual arts, French, ECM, mathematics...).
- The festival will also allow children to develop critical thinking and to consider animated images, beyond entertainment, as a communication tool.

#### PRINCIPLE OF THE FESTIVAL

- The festival is free for all educational, cultural and social organizations, teachers, parents and children around the world.
- The festival takes place over 3 months (from April to June) to give teachers and parents the necessary time to offer students and children the associated educational activities.
- Each structure, teacher or parent registers their children online and proposes educational activities following the viewing of the films. In a positive dimension, each child votes for his or her favorite film. The report of the votes is done online on the festival website.
- Students discover the films and participate in activities in the space of the participating organizations, at school or at home. The festival allows a family exchange and educational activities from a playful support.
- A selection committee, made up of 18 representatives of the partners, selects 15 short films.
- A pedagogical team, made up of teachers and film professionals, creates the pedagogical activities.
- A pedagogical committee, made up of representatives of the partners, supervises the pedagogical team.
- The copyrights holders receive a remuneration of 500 USD per short film in exchange for participation in the festival and permission for educational, cultural and social institutions to use the films in the framework of the festival and for non-commercial public broadcasting. The sponsors of the festival each award a prize of USD 1,000 to a film of their choice. An annual fee for optional participation in the online educational platform of Films for children 1 with a guaranteed minimum of USD 100 per year for 5 years will also be offered at the end of the festival.
- The "children's prize" 2 is awarded in each of the 5 categories of the festival by all the participating children.

#### **EXTENSION OF THE FESTIVAL**

- The festival continues throughout the year for schools and families.
- Parents discover a new catalog for their children and a free and ad-free portal for families offers an extension of the festival and the viewing of 300 short films classified by age, theme and key words in a caring environment conducive to exchanges and communication within the family.
- Teachers can use a new tool to accompany school programs and rely on the educational dimension of cinema in their practice with students. A platform, developed in partnership with Réseau Canopé, and with the support of the French Ministry of Education and the CNC, offers educational, cultural and social institutions, upon subscription, actions and regular practice of education to and through the moving image. https://plateforme.films-pour-enfants.com
  - The festival, which is very simple in its form, offers an introduction to image education to all children's professionals, who can then extend this experience through different schemes proposed in their respective countries.
  - 1- The platform allows teachers and educational, cultural and social institutions to make non-commercial public broadcasts.
  - 2- The children's prize does not give rise to any additional remuneration, unlike the prizes of the festival's financial partners.

#### **SELECTION OF SHORT FILMS**

A committee made up of representatives of the partners selects 15 short films from the catalog of short films proposed by Films for children
and the partners, the 2022 selection committee is composed of 18 members.

#### The short films are:

- films on the themes of the festival: humanism and ecology.
- In a broad sense, cultural diversity, sustainable development, solidarity, friendship, respect for others, tolerance, human rights, citizenship.
- animated films or a mixture of animation and real shots;
- films with a minimum length of 1 minute and maximum length of 20 minutes;
- silent films (with music and sound but without dialogue); they may be watched by children all over the world;
- films produced before December 31, 2019, without any other production date limitation.
- The selection criteria are originality, the artistic quality of the staging and the poetic dimension of the short films.
- The 15 short films are organized in 5 programs defined by the age of the spectators according to the categories elaborated by Serge Tisseron and the NPO 3-6-9-12. [3-4-5 years] [6-7-8 years] [9-10-11 years] [12-13-14 years] [15-16-17 years]

#### **FESTIVAL PRIZES**

- The "Children's Prize" is awarded in each of the 5 festival categories by all the participating children.
- The festival's financial partners each award a prize of USD 1,000 to a film of their choice.
   For the 2022 Festival, CinéMômes will award a prize to a short film of its choice among the 15 short films selected.

#### **CREATION OF THE FESTIVAL'S EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES**

- The creation of the festival's educational activities by a team of teachers and film professionals is supervised by an educational
  committee made up of "Films pour enfants" and partner representatives.
- Each short film is accompanied by :
  - "Questioning the Film" activity. This activity, accompanied by pedagogical extensions, aims to ensure that students have understood the story, the psychology of the characters but also the themes and messages of the films;
  - a "toolbox" for use in all lessons and a list of common activities for each film;
  - viewing tips and a selection grid created in collaboration with the NPO 3-6-9-12;
  - a file entitled "Questioning an animated film" created by Anne-Marie Filho, honorary school inspector.

#### PERSONALIZED EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES BY COUNTRY

#### Depending on the support of each region (in progress)

- Each country benefits from educational material adapted to its territory.
   Educational activities and transversal resources adapted to the particularities of each region offer the possibility to discover local characteristics, authors of the region (literature, painting...). School visits (museum, garden, crafts...) are also proposed.
- The festival focuses on humanism and ecology; partnerships with regional nature parks and eco-museums allow students to participate in
  the festival, to watch the films, to vote for their favorite films, directly in the partners' space, but also to participate in additional activities
  and educational extensions proposed and organized by the partners.

#### PEDAGOGICAL SUPPORT FOR THE FESTIVAL

- The viewing of the short films is accompanied throughout the festival, from March to June, by educational activities. Students or children participate in the festival activities in class and/or at home; teachers and parents are free to propose one or more of the festival activities but also to propose their own activities based on the short films.
- In each country, the festival is accompanied by institutional and associative actors of image education.
   Extensions are proposed in the form of film analysis, meetings with artists, visits to museums and cultural sites and the creation by children of an animated film on the theme of the festival. Depending on partnerships (in progress)

Teachers register their classes online. Parents can also register their children directly.

The rights holders will receive a remuneration of 1 000 euros per short film selected.

#### 15 educational activities

Each short film is accompanied by educational sheets dedicated to the understanding of the films. These activities, in the form of pdf files, are carried out in class or at home.

Transversal resources propose to discover the local particularities of the countries, the authors of the country (literature, painting...) but also school visits (museum, garden, crafts...).

#### **Children's Award**

Each student votes for his or her favorite short film, and the winners receive the "Children's Award" in each of the 5 categories.

#### Accompaniment and extension of the festival

#### Formations et ateliers (under consideration)

Training sessions and workshops organized by the association "Films pour enfants" take place in class at the request of teachers who prefer to be accompanied.

#### Plateforme d'éducation à et par l'image animée

At the end of the festival, the 15 short films will be added to the catalog of the subscription platform of the NPO "Films pour enfants". The rights holders are remunerated; in exchange they authorize the public broadcasting of the films from the platform: https://plateforme.films-pour-enfants.com.



## Résultats internationaux : Prix des enfants 2021



#### 340,418 participants from 115 countries.

**10,161 teachers** and **4,092 parents** registered a total of **326,165 children** from 3 to 18 years old divided in 5 age categories. The children in class with their teachers and/or at home with their parents, following educational activities dedicated to the understanding of the films, voted among the 3 films of each category for their favorite film.

22% of all children (71,756 children) participated in the 3-4-5 age category. 33% (107,634 children) in the 6-7-8 age category, 27% (88,065) in the 9-10-11 age category, 10% (32,617) in the 12-13-14 age category, 8% (26,093) in the 15-16-17 years and older category.







## **Participation report by country**

An increased participation for this second edition of the festival.

**326,165 children in 2021** (303,190 in school and 22,975 at home) compared to **287,776 children in 2020**. The number of participating countries is also increasing, **115 countries in 2021** compared to **35 countries in 2020**. *However, some countries participated much less than others.* 

One difference from 2021 is that many teachers in 2021 enrolled multiple classes. Many parents also enrolled not only their children, but multiple families at the same time.



### **Teachers' testimonial**

Selection of spontaneous messages from teachers in metropolitan France and overseas departments and regions

Many teachers communicated their enthusiasm by sending spontaneous messages.



About the title of the film "Carpe Diem"

#### 8- What does the title of the film "Carpe Diem" mean?

The expression in Latin "Carpe diem" means "pick the day".

"Carpe diem, quam minimum credula postero", which could be translated into English as "Seize the present day without worrying about the next day" is a verse written by the Latin poet Horace in 23 BC.

In this poem Horace invites us to enjoy the present moment and to appreciate simple pleasures in harmony with what nature gives us. Horace was an epicurean and the poem is not an incitement to enjoy the present without morality or reflection, without thinking about consequences, but on the contrary to a search for orderly, healthy and responsible pleasures.

The title is therefore a play on words between the Latin maxim "Carpe diem" and "carp", a freshwater fish. "Carpe diem" would then mean: The "carp of the day".

### Fish in New Aquitaine, France

#### 1- Do you know the carp?

Carp are freshwater fish with low salinity compared to sea water.

Carp live in the slow moving waters of rivers as well as in the stagnant waters of lakes or ponds.

Carp originated in Europe, Asia and the Far East and were later imported to other continents such as North America and Australia.

Carp have been farmed since the Neolithic, the polished stone age (8000 - 2000 BC). Today, it is one of the most farmed fish in the world. Its farming is called "**carp farming**". Other common farmed fish are sea bass, sea bream, tilapia, panga and salmon.

Carp are also used as ornamental fish. This is the case of the "**koi carp**", which originated as a result of cross-breeding between selected individuals of the common carp, which originally lived in ponds used as reservoirs for rice fields in China, Korea and Japan.

#### 2- What are the main fish caught in New Aquitaine?

The lamprey, the yellow eel, the elver, the vannet, the monkfish but also the cuttlefish and the squid. And in the ponds, pike, pike-perch, perch, tench, roach, gudgeon and also carp!

#### 3- What are the main farmed fish in New Aguitaine?


In France, sea bass, sea bream, salmon, trout, turbot, meagre and sole are the main farmed fish.

In New Aquitaine, there are over 600 freshwater fish farms, mainly for trout.

Sturgeon farming in New Aquitaine makes France the third largest producer of domestic caviar in the world!
